Dear Parents and Carers,

### Internet Safety Week

This week has seen us celebrating National Internet Safety week. This year the theme was 'Want to talk about it? Making space for conversations about life online' and it was great to see lots of you at our Internet Safety workshops this week. Below is information to follow these up that will help you with keeping your children safe online, outside of school and at home:

- Talk with your children about the games they play, the videos they watch and the content they are accessing online – doing these things together can highlight how positive the Internet can be.
- Have conversations with children without judgement.
- The earlier you begin these conversations the better.
- Explain that being kind and respectful online makes the Internet fun and safe for everyone.
- Talk to children about making safe online choices, just as you would do when offline.
- Remind children that it is okay to say 'no' to people online.
- Know where you can learn more about their favourite games/ apps and how to support them.
- Ensure your child knows to get support if things go wrong by talking to their safe adults.
- Reassure children that whatever happens online, you are there to support them.
- Set an example with your own positive online habits as your child will be watching.
- Think before you share – do not give out personal information to people you do not know.
- Check in with your child regularly about their online use, because child interests change regularly.
